

I love what she has to say about "familying" beyond blood relatives and the hard sacred work that this is.

There are times when practicing our love for our neighbor becomes a call to loving our family (who may not be blood relatives.) As I write this, it is my honor to accompany my godmother through what is likely the last season of her life. It is so hard. I am ashamed to admit that I should have been doing a better job at this all along. At the same time, I am taking the grace and living into this moment, loving her and feeling her love for me.

I think this is family-ing. The deep intersection of our lives. It's messy.

Hard, holy times with family at the inbetween times in life as we deal with our own feelings, identity, and gratitude that God is God and we aren't. We are healing together as we do mundane things like cleaning her house, going to the doctor, and sharing a cup of tea. My life has been so blessed by hers, and I am learning so much about myself in this moment. That's why family-ing is hard — because it is personal. It is about deep God-like love.

I am struck by Nicodemus coming to Jesus at night with his faith questions in John 3. Jesus is pushing him to move from his "head" faith to a spiritual, embodied, heart-felt faith. The invitation Jesus extends is to be born again. To heal from the past framework of the faith and to understand God's overflowing love. We even get a taste of Jesus' sarcasm, or is it irritation, he expresses that this religious leader doesn't already know that faith is a spiritual, soulful experience.

It is this genuine and messy love that makes family-ing a call. A call from God to love in the hard moments. To show up with compassion and grace in the same way God always shows up. God did not send Jesus to this world to condemn the world. The whole

enterprise is about love. Our family, or closest friends, are the first relational circle we are called to show compassion. I am praying that you find this kind of soulful love in this season of Lent – and offer it back to those closest to you.

"Nurturing Your Mental Wellbeing"

Breath Prayer Gracious God, Inhale: May the light of your presence

Exhale: Shine through me to

others. Amen

Ephesians 5:8-9 "for once you were darkness but now in the Lord you are light. Walk as children of light, for the fruit of the light is found in all that is good, right, and true." How is Christ's light reflected in you?

Walking as children of light can at times be challenging and even overwhelming. It might feel like a heavy call to embody. The good news is, we do not do it on our own. We hear in this Ephesians passage that we are called to live in goodness, righteousness, and

truth as part of a larger community. We are called to walk and live as children of light together- in relationship, with the body of Christ.

The body of Christ is big.
Everyone in this body has unique gifts—and sometimes this Body, doesn't get along so well, or even like each other much. So then, how can we live together—reflecting Christ's light?

We are empowered by the Holy Spirit to live together by caring for the wellbeing of each other. According to the Earl E. Bakken Center for Spirituality, "Wellbeing is a state of balance or alignment in body, mind, and spirit." Wellbeing is influenced by "6 factors; Environment, Health, Community, Relationship, Purpose and Security." Wellbeing "reflects an understanding and respect for our interconnectedness as human beings and with the natural world."

We, who lived in darkness, have been redeemed by Christ's saving love and so we now have new life and live in the Light--reflecting Christ's light to all whom cross our path. Because of whose we are, Christ's, we are called to action, to daily reflect Christ's light by

- sharing, care, concern and compassion for each other;
- showing a commitment to justice;
- shining Christ's love, for all human beings.

This Scripture passage is about our new identity, our new life as baptized believers and followers of Christ—and in this new role, we have a new purpose, a new calling. An invitation is extended to each of us to explore how the Gospel story impacts and shapes how you and how we live into each new day as members of the body of Christ—sharing, showing, and shining Christ's deep care and love for the wellbeing of all.

Northeastern MN Synod

The synod office has moved! It was made by the confirmands in the building where we now reside.) The building that the synod purchased in 2000 has been sold. The office space was spacious, but not necessarily what was needed in 2023, as synod staff do some of their work remotely and within congregations across Northeastern Minnesota. While the building served the needs of the synod for many years, there were several pending repairs needed, with the biggest problem being that it was not handicap accessible. In addition, the synod council felt that it would be more cost effective to move into a space with a ministry partner/congregation. After researching several sites across the greater Duluth area, it was determined that the office could be easily located and accessed on the London Road entrance to First Lutheran Church in Duluth. Your synod staff have been busy sorting, pitching, packing, and moving years' worth of records and office necessities to our new home. Please note that our address has changed to 1111 London Road, Duluth, MN 55802. Our telephone number remains the same; 218-724-4424. Look for notice of an Open House in the very near future!

Staff transitions are also happening! Deacon Brenda Tibbetts has announced her retirement after serving in the church for twenty-two years, eight of



which have been as part of your synod staff. She will be transitioning from her work as the Synod Minister for Leadership Support over the summer and will be fully retired as of September 1, 2023. The Synod Council has issued a call to Deacon Susan Williams (picture on right) to serve in this position, with a start date of April 15, 2023. Both Deacon Brenda and Deacon Susan will have plenty of overlap as they tend to the call process, roster and first call administration, congregations in transition, and the leadership events of the synod. We will formally welcome Deacon Susan as she is installed at Synod Assembly on Friday, April 28, 2023. We will have a service of Godspeed for Deacon Brenda as part of the closing worship at Synod Assembly on Sunday, April 30, 2023. Finally, there will be a reception of welcome and thanksgiving for both Deacons on Saturday night of the Assembly, April 29, 2023. As we give God thanks for Deacon Brenda's

faithful service over the years, we also give God thanks for the capable gifts that Deacon Susan will bring to this position.
