

From Pastor Seth

The Fuller Institute on Youth Ministry has identified three big questions — belonging, identity, and purpose - that we face as we go through transitions in life. Youth and young adults, in particular are dealing with these questions all the time — both because they are facing them for the first time, and because they experience transition almost constantly. This article is a reflection on the second question: identity.

Identity

Have you ever noticed how much we can guess about someone based on learning one thing about them?

For example, take the cars we drive. Just based on how expensive a car looks, we might guess at someone's income and penchant for flash. The make and model might lead us to wonder about the driver's political leanings, occupation, or family size. A bright yellow Bug says something different to us that a red Ferrari, which says something different than a F-150. And that's all before we even notice anyone's bumper stickers!

All of these things are guesses at possible aspects of identity: personality, family, race and ethnicity, occupation and life station, education, politics, worldview, interests and hobbies. They're the kinds of things we might write in a one paragraph biography, and we make observations and judgements on these things all the time.

But, of course, as anyone who's ever been on a first date or a job interview can attest,

we can't really know someone from a resume, a paragraph, or even a few minutes with someone. One 2018 study from the University of Kansas estimated that it takes 40 and 60 hours to form a casual friendship, 80-100 hours to transition to being a friend, and more than 200 hours together to become good friends.

So, why it so hard to really know people, when guessing pieces of identity comes so naturally?

Perhaps this is because these superficial pieces of identity are not the core of who we are. Perhaps we only truly know people when we spend enough time with them to glimpse their soul.

Identity is, at times of transition for young and old alike, a live and impactful question, and our sense of our own identity shapes how we live and interact with the world. And identity is hard to navigate, with so many pressures and options and pitfalls. But here's the good news: Jesus gives the best possible answer to identity questions.

Because Jesus, through our baptism, gives us a priceless, eternal identity:

"A beloved child of God."

When we take on this identity, a few things happen.

First, we slowly become more able to see friends, acquaintances, and strangers alike as beloved children of God, and our snap judgements take on less weight.

Second, because we are surer of our own place in God's eyes, we have less need to seek the validation of others.

Third, the other pieces of our identity fall into place, because of the firm foundation we find in this identity.

Fourth, we have freedom to go forth and boldly do what Jesus calls us to do, because no matter what happens, we will always remain God's beloved child.

May you know today, beyond the shadow of a doubt, that you are a beloved child of God, and that there's nothing you, or anyone else, can do about!
