

#### From Pastor Seth

The Fuller Institute on Youth Ministry has identified three big questions – belonging, identity, and purpose - that we face as we go through transitions in life. Youth and young adults in particular are dealing with these questions all the time – both because they are facing them for the first time, and because they experience transition almost constantly. But if we're honest with ourselves, we all wrestle with these questions and can grow from understanding them better, especially in times of transition. This article is a reflection on the third question: purpose.

Did you ever read any of the "Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy" books? If you've never heard of it, Douglas Adams originally wrote the story as a British radio comedy in 1978, but it has been adapted into multiple books, a play, and a 2005 Hollywood film. The storyline features a few humans bumbling their way across space and trying to find a "home" again after alien bureaucrats destroy earth to build an "interspace highway". Yeah, it's more than a little kooky, and also pretty fun. There's one moment that I love (and is oft-quoted), and it comes when a galactic super-computer, built by super-intelligent mice, is ready after 1000's of years of computing to give an answer to The Big Question, THE Question. In the film version, there are crowds and crowds of people, cheering and excited for the final answer to THE Question. The mice go to up to the massive computer, ask it if it's ready, and then as, "What is the answer to the Question, THE Question?" And the computer's answer? "Well, I've given it a lot of thought... thousands of years, in fact... and here's what I came up with: Forty-Two." "Forty-Two???" "Forty-Two." Well, not to ruin the plot too much, but this answer didn't turn out to be too satisfying to the people or the mice. (If you're curious, the computer decides to give the question over to earthlings to have humans come up with what THE Question actually is). As humans, we've been asking this question in a multitude of different ways for as long as we've been around: "What does it all mean? Why am I here? What's our purpose?" And we tell stories to help us make sense of the meaning of our place on earth and our purpose on this earth.

As people of faith, though we have a particular story to tell. Our story is this: we are created to be in relationship with God. That's why we're here. The same is true for all animals, and plants, and all of creation, and all of the universe, for that matter. We do this, in part, simply by existing: all that is alive, all that has breath, sings praises to God, simply by being who God has created us to be. Maple trees praise God by sprouting, growing, shedding leaves, pointing up or out or curving around, by being whatever God has made them to be. Cats and dogs praise God by barking and purring, shedding, racing around, making friends, making enemies, and generally being the wonderful, frustrating, fantastic rascals that God made them to be. So it is for us: we praise God simply by being who God has made us to be.

And as disciples of Jesus, our purpose goes further. Those who believe, as we do, share one purpose: to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to love our neighbors as ourselves. This purpose is powerful beyond measure. It colors everything we do, every decision we make, with a divine rainbow of purpose that bursts with life and meaning. It means that no matter who you are or what you are doing, your purpose, in every waking moment, is to live in the exuberant, brilliant, fantastic rainbow of God's love, and to love and serve God and your neighbor. What's our answer to THE Question? Without faith, "Forty-two" might be as good an answer as we can come up with. But with faith, we have a better story to tell: a story of relationship, love, and service.

May you find yourself basking in the colors of God's love, and may you find your purpose today in discipleship, no matter where you find yourself.


