

From Pastor Seth

Remember what winter feels like? (Of course you do. You live in Minnesota!)

I ask because, when you read this, it'll be spring, at least according to the calendar. Gordy's is open, we've had plenty of sunshine, and as I write this, we're about to have a bonus springtime blizzard. All around, it's spring in Minnesota! So, now that it is spring, whether the weather is actually warm or not... do you remember what winter felt like?

Not just the cold on your face or the effort of shoveling snow. I mean what winter feels like – the feeling it's easy to get in February, when the days are short and it's hard to get any real sunlight, warm winter notwithstanding. Even those of us who enjoy winter can get the sense of being stuck in darkness and cold.

It's part of what makes spring so wonderful! It might be still be windy and cold, and the threat of a blizzard is never truly gone until mid-summer, but spring feels different – it's exciting, even hopeful.

Perhaps this is why, almost for as long as the church has been the church, we've celebrated Easter in the spring.

For in a way, the world we live in can feel like living in perpetual winter.

The New Testament often describes the power of death and sin as darkness or night. In the gospel of John, Jesus himself is described as "the Light of the World".

It can be easy to take this too far – darkness can be beautiful, and good things happen in the dark (take Isaiah 45, for example). At times in Christian history, these themes have been used by white folks to put down people with dark skin – a clear misuse of the Word.

It's also not hard for us to see, though, that the power of death and sin are never far away in our world. Wars rage and children go hungry while politicians choose party and self over solutions. Families break apart after of unhealed hurts. Honest people get taken advantage of. It's no wonder that scripture tells us about the forces of evil are more than just a few individuals making mistakes.

So it can be easy to feel like we're living in a world of constant mid-winter, even when the calendar turns over.

But the story of Easter actually tells us something different.

This story doesn't deny the evil present in our world. It's not summer.

But it does tell us that new life is breaking forth. In Romans 13, Paul writes that the night is almost gone, and the day is near. And in 1 Corinthians 15, he writes that Christ's resurrection – Easter – are the first fruits of the new life to

come.

It's like we're living in between winter and summer, in between the death and new life. Or, to put it more simply, Easter means that we're living in the season of spring.

Jesus's resurrection, 2000 years ago, means that we have seen a glimpse of what's to come.

It's not here yet fully, but we've seen it, and it's on the way.

So when you start to see the hazy green on a tree-covered horizon or notice buds start to shoot out from the ground, you'll be reminded:

Christ's resurrection has already taken place. Christ's

return is assured. And we get to live in God's springtime!

Peace be with you and yours this Easter season.
