

What does it mean to say that "All are Welcome"?
"All are Welcome" – what a beautiful sentiment!

I love how much Lutheran (and many other mainline churches) have taken to this statement in the last 10-20 years, especially when it comes to communion and other important ways of participating in a faith community. But "All are Welcome" can become difficult, in practice, can't it? Consider one possibility. Someone joins a church because they like the socializing and the music. When they join, they're ok with the idea of faith but pretty unsure about the whole thing, and the church welcomes their questions and doubts with open arms (as they rightly should!)But after a while, something changes in their tone and their demeanor, and they begin to openly demean the Christian faith and to quietly talk people out of praying, reading scripture, serving, or worshipping. (This actually happened in my campus ministry group when I was in college). Would we still say to this person, "You are welcome here", unequivocally? Or consider this. A church member begins volunteering with youth. For a while, it goes ok, but then youth start reporting inappropriate comments in small group sessions. Nothing illegal, sure, but their actions cause disruption in the community and break down trust.

Would we still welcome this adult in youth ministry?

To me, the clear answer to both of these questions is that they would be welcome, but their behavior would not be. In order for the community to be safe, mission-focused, and loving, we need to be loving towards the whole community, and that means creating safe, respectful, faithful spaces. But this is true everywhere, isn't it? Think about your last workplace or community group. Were there things that someone could do that would create pushback or turmoil? In any situation, we often have rules, both written and unwritten, that guide behavior.

And sometimes the unwritten rules matter more than the written ones! So what does this mean for a goal of "All are Welcome"? Should we stop saying it altogether? Heck no! As disciples of Jesus, we should strive to be welcoming – to welcome the outcasts, the poor, the others, as Jesus did.

What it does mean is that "All are Welcome" refers to identity, not behavior. No one should be kept from a church community because of who they are, and our unwritten rules need to be adaptable and negotiable for new people and new ways of being.

At the same time, "All are Welcome" also doesn't mean that anything goes. As Paul encourages us in 1

Corinthians: "All things are lawful, but not all things are beneficial."

This is true in all facets of life — boundaries create the possibility of real relationships and real community. But those boundaries should never get in the way of us forming relationships with all kinds of people — and what a joy it is when we connect with someone new!

I am praying for you, and rooting for you, in every part of life! Christ's peace be with you and all those you love this summer. And may all you do be done in Christ's love!
