

## What does God really promise us??

Last week at confirmation, we talked about this

question: what are God's promises for us?

At first it might seem easy – or like a question you covered in confirmation and haven't had to think about ever since!

But once we get into it, it gets a little trickier.

For example, here's a few possible ideas. How many of these questions would you say yes to?

- 1. God promises to keep us safe
- 2. God promises to help us succeed in life
- 3. God promises to bless us when we are good.

If you're having trouble, you should feel good – because Scripture has multiple perspectives on each of these issue. In the book of Psalms, one Psalm will praise God for keeping the psalmist safe while another will lament that God has left the writer to the wolves. The book of Proverbs clearly takes the stance that God rewards the righteous and punishes the wicked.

But, of course, we know that life is not so simple – sometimes, or even often,

people who climb over others make it to the top, while faithful people are not immune from affliction.

It's a conundrum! Some parts of scripture say one thing, while others say something else.

So what do we do with this?

Well, for one, we always need to consider the genre of a book. Psalms is a book of poetry; Proverbs is a book of wisdom sayings. Proverbs describes what might be generally true (for example, treating others well will lead to good things), but it's not a book of hard and fast promises.

But more importantly, we need to consider what we **hope** for compare with what we are **promised**.

I believe that God is at work to keep us safe in the world, but God does not guarantee safety. I believe that God plants seeds in our hearts and guides us, but God does not guarantee success. I believe that God wants good things for us, but God does not guarantee blessing.

So what does God promise? What would be on your list?

In Martin Luther's Small Catechism, he writes that baptism brings "forgiveness of sins, redeems from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe it, as the words and promise of God declare."

Later, he writes that water can do such things because "the Holy Spirit is poured out on us richly, through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs, according to the hope of eternal life."

And then? "The saying is sure."

God promises, through faith, the Word, and the waters of baptism:

- 1. Forgiveness
- 2. Redemption
- 3. Eternal Life
- 4. Heirship
- 5. The Holy Spirit

That's a good place for a list, and for our faith, to start. The rest, I think, can be up for discussion, but the core of our faith is in God's unshakeable promises, as signified and received in our baptism.

As Luther says: cling to the promises! That's what faith is all about.

I pray today that you and yours have a blessed month and a fantastic fall!
