

Advent Food for Thought

Before we get to the Bazaar, the parties, and

the candles, here's some Advent food for thought:

Darkness and Light: We sometimes generalize the categories of light and dark as good and bad. And, of course, we all need a little light in our lives, especially as the days get shorter and the nights get longer.

But dark doesn't mean bad. Good things can happen in the dark. We rest and grow in the dark; growing bodies need sleep to grow, and all our bodies need sleep to shut down and recharge. And even when we're awake, we can think deeper, breathe slower, or feel differently in the quiet that dark brings.

Christmas Eve services often feature both darkness and light. This Christmas Eve, as the service moves toward its conclusion, notice how the darkness impacts you. Does it build anticipation? Does it bring calm? Anxiety? Togetherness? Loneliness?

Advent and Christmas helps us embrace the goodness of gathering around the light as well as dwelling in the dark this season.

Waiting and Hope: Advent is a season about a kind of coming. In our Scripture readings, we hear prophecies of the coming of Christ from Isaiah and from John the Baptist, and we retell the strange and wonderful tales of Mary and Joseph, shepherds and animals, angels and archangels. We hear again its

themes of poverty and power, wandering and wondering, refugees and welcome.

And as we do, we also remember and prepare for the coming - the second coming - of Jesus. The nativity is not only in the past, it's also a sign and a guarantee of the return of Christ. And though the story of Christ's return is mysterious and unknown, it is also good, for God is good, and Christ's final coming can only mean good things for a people and a world who wait desperately for new hope.

Advent and Christmas help us embrace the goodness of waiting – not only for Christmas, but for the coming of Jesus.

Love: The holidays serve as a time of coming together. Our family gatherings around hearths and Christmas trees are, for many of us, the defining element of the season.

What I especially appreciate, though, is the way that Christmas can move us beyond ourselves to see and to serve our neighbors. Families volunteering at shelters and nursing homes. Parents, grandparents, or friends giving gifts of goats or chicks to Lutheran World Relief and the like in place of toys or clothes. Churches and individuals sending cards to the sick and homebound. Generosity and love for the needy is expressed in all kinds of ways.

Advent and Christmas help us embrace the goodness of love – not as a requirement or as another item on the checklist, but as our first priority. May the God who will always wait for you, who is with you in darkness and in light, and who loves you beyond measure, dwell close by you this Advent and Christmas.

Davis, and JoAnn Gustafson. If you have questions/concerns/ideas please feel free to contact a committee member.


2024 Thrivent Food Shelf Challenge
