

### **Unhappy Happy Things?**

What makes you *happy*? You've probably got at least a few answers to this question. Maybe a good book or a new episode of your favorite show. Maybe a cup of coffee or a bowl of ice cream. Maybe time spent alone, or maybe time spent with a good friend.

I certainly like most of these things! But what I sometimes puzzle over is: why do things like this sometimes also make us unhappy?

Consider, for a moment: pretend you've got a brand-new tv show that you love. And there's 15 of it, but the only way you're allowed to watch it is that you have to watch it all at once – once you start, you can't leave your house or do anything else outside!

Would you do it?
Some of us probably thing – heck yes! A whole day to stay in and watch a great show?? Sign me up!! But there's probably some hesitation, even for those who would sign up for this challenge. Because think of how you'd feel at the end of that day! Stiff, empty, and more than a little bit cranky.

Why might this be?? If a good TV show makes us happy, why doesn't a whole day of a good tv show make us extra happy?

Well, clearly, there can be too much of a good thing.

Chocolate is amazing, but too much chocolate gives us a stomach ache.

But I think there's something else at play here. A whole day, forced to be inside and forced to watch someone else's life or someone else's story, disconnects us from the world around us and even from ourselves.

I recently heard an author say that religion, even if it isn't true, does all these amazing things for us who participate in it. It gives us deep, authentic community; it offers us purpose and meaning; and it helps us understand our story and our identity.

And, to be sure, we can and do get some version of these things in other ways or places. We can make friends social clubs or sports, we can find purpose through a job or with family, we can find identity in politics or hobbies. But nothing offers us the depth of community, purpose, and identity that religion can. And maybe religion works so well for the most important things in life because there's deep truth within it – for Christians, the truth that God has made us, and that God wants to be in relationship with us.

So maybe that's part of why something that makes us happy in the moment doesn't always make us happy in the long run: because, ultimately, we are made to be in relationship with God, and knowing God means engaging in all these good things that God has made for us outside: meaningful community, meaningful purpose, meaningful living. Thanks be to God!

May you be blessed, challenged, and strengthened this Lenten season.



This is a great opportunity to get to know your neighbor, while enjoying a meal together. We also read the Daily Bread at each table. This is a community dinner and all are welcome to attend.

Ginny Kortie-Castle joined our meeting to discuss doing The Lutheran Course as a way to strengthen the church. After some discussion, it was decided to hold the class on Sundays, March 2-April 13, 9:45 AM-11:30 AM, informal learning and conversation to explore. Bethesda has had four baptisms this past year. CYFED has been investigating possible faith formation programs for families with children birth to pre-K. CYFED presented Frolic: Little Steps, Big Faith to four of our families. They were interested in some of the components, the

personalized monthly newsletters that share developmental information and age-appropriate faith formation ideas, board books, and if possible (with their busy lives') occasional gatherings with other young Christian parents.

CYFED will ask WELCA for the startup funds to purchase copies of these newsletters that could be distributed monthly to the families, 16 board books, and two different birth-pre-K faith music CDs to trial and share with families. The overall cost will be \$200. We look forward to meeting the needs of our littlest congregation members.


