

What's that got to do with it?!?

Here's a fun (ok, nerdy, but also fun and important!)

Bible trivia question:

What does the story of Pentecost, and the book of James, have in common???

The book of James is famous for it's calls for action. And James doesn't mess around. Twice in James chapter 2, we read this absolute barnburner of a verse:

"Faith without works is dead."

Dead?!? Ouch!

James was one of Martin Luther's least favorite books because of its emphasis on the necessity of works in faith.

As Lutherans, it's crucial for us to study not just the books we like but also the ones we have more trouble with – like the book of James!

So what does this somewhat cranky but definitely exciting epistle have to do with Pentecost – with the coming of the Holy Spirit?

Well, if we look closely, Jesus actually shares this same call to action as James does.

In the Pentecost story in John 20, Jesus is appearing to all the disciples for the first time. First, of course, he says, "Peace be with you" so they don't freak out. But after a moment, he says to them something similar to what was written for the early church a few decades later. This is what he says:

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

Then he breathed on them, and they received the Holy Spirit —what the story of Pentecost is all about.

In other words, what the book of James has to do with the story of Pentecost is a call to action.

Jesus was commissioning Mary Magdalene, Peter, and all the other disciples to carry on the work he had started through the work of the Holy Spirit.

He was commissioning them not only to faith as belief but to faith as love – love for God, for each other, and for their neighbors in need.

Who has God "commissioned" you to serve in your life? And how about now – who is God commissioning you to love, to care for, or to serve?

Whoever it is, don't forget that the Holy Spirit works with you to do the work of Jesus. You don't have to do it

all – just go with what the Spirit is already doing, and let all you do be done in love.

May you have a blessed spring for you and for all whom you love.
